VICTORIA'S COMMITMENT TO THE FIRST NATION OF NA-CHO NYAK DUN

VICTORIA GOLD'S EAGLE GOLD MINE IS LOCATED WITHIN THE TRADITIONAL TERRITORY OF THE FIRST NATION OF NA-CHO NYAK DUN (FNNND). In October 2011, Victoria and the First Nation signed a mutually created and implemented *Comprehensive Cooperation and Benefits Agreement* or CBA.

On July 1, 2020, Victoria Gold reached a key milestone; achieving commercial production at the company's owned and operated Eagle Gold Mine.

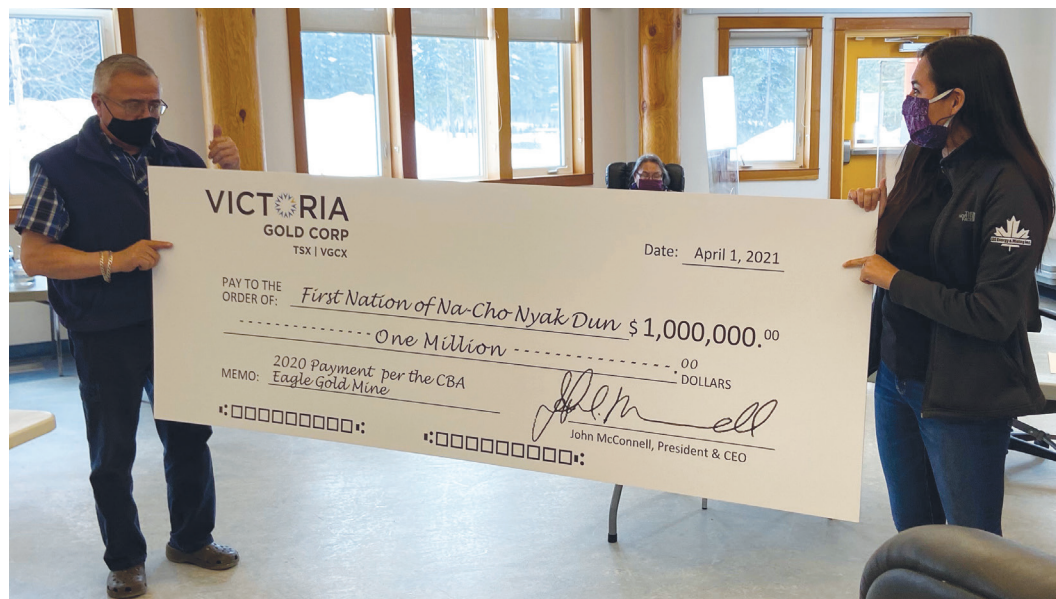
This accomplishment has resulted in an inaugural financial contribution from Victoria Gold to FNNND for the last half of 2020 when Eagle went into Commercial Production, which combined with other commitments per the CBA for H2 2020, totaled \$1,000,000.00.

Michelle Dawson-Beattie, Victoria's Community Liaison, presented a cheque to FNNND Chief Simon Mervyn on behalf of the company on April 1, 2021.

The CBA, provides for certainty surrounding the mine and employment, training and contracting opportunities for FNNND and its citizens. The agreement further establishes a process for ongoing open and respectful communication between Victoria and the First Nation for the life of the mine and beyond.

The CBA also provides for financial benefit stemming from the success of the Eagle Gold Mine. This significant amount presented to FNNND reflects the financial benefits from the first six months of the Eagle Gold Mine's production and other commitments as outlined in the CBA.

The property is accessible by road year-round and is connected to Yukon Energy Corp's electrical grid. The mine will be a significant contributor to Yukon employing 350 to 400 people.
